1 Transcript – CBP Supervisory Agent Brandon & Defendant

- 2 **Incident Date:** 29 March 13
- 3 Case #: TR-13-050961
- 4 Location: SR-86, Milepost 146.6, Southern, AZ (CBP Roadblock)
- 5 $\mathbf{B} = Agent Brandon$
- 6 \mathbf{D} = Defendant
- 7 After deputy Audetat first approaches Defendant but but before deputy Vatterrodt asks for Defendant's
- 8 license and before deputy Audetat issues Defendant a citation, Agent Brandon comes over to Defendant
- 9 alone to tell him the Border Patrol's inspection is complete. Brando approaches at approximately 1601:
- 10 **B:** "Hello sir. Ah, the Border Patrol is done with their inspection. Right now you're being held for Pima
- 11 County and they may cite you for impeding traffic"
- 12 Brandon then walks back to the the other agents and deputies.
- 13 After talking with Agent Grayson, Defendant asks to speak to his supervisor, Agent Brandon. A lengthy
- 14 discussion ensues with excerpts from that discussion appearing below.
- 15 **B:** "You wanted to see me?"
- 16 **D:** "Yes I did but first could I get the name of your supervisor"
- 17 **B:** "My supervisor?"
- 18 **D:** "Yes"
- 19 **B:** "Watch Commander Spencer"
- 20 **D:** "Spencer, OK and you were here throughout....I believe you were here throughout the entire
- 21 encounter. Is that correct?"
- 22 **B:** "Except for the first 30 seconds to a minute"
- 23 **D:** "OK, Were you inside the building or were you just not...."
- 24 **B:** "I was sitting over there by the canopy"
- 25 **D:** "So you..."
- 26 **B:** "So I saw you come up and I waved at you because most of us recognize you."
- 27 **D:** "So you recognized me as I came up?"
- 28 **B:** "*Correct*"
- 29 **D:** "OK and it sounds like the agent at primary also recognized me in fact he told me that he
- 30 recognized me as I came up"
- 31 **B:** "*Correct*"
- 32 **D:** "Ah, could you tell me what the scope of this checkpoint operation is?"
- 33 **B:** "Immigration"
- 34 **D:** "Yeah, immigration, so...the dog that you have out there today..."
- 35 A discussion on CBP drug dog ensues....
- 36

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- 1 Discussion picks up again at approximately 1629:
- 2 **D:** "Getting back to my particular stop here as you know you recognized me as I came up here, I came
- 3 to a stop before the stop sign, I stopped as the stop sign directed. Neither agent in my recollection,
- 4 there were two agents I believe the second agent was McKnight, the first agent was Grayson. Neither
- 5 one of them said anything to me when I came to a stop. Is that standard procedure for agents at
- 6 primary to not to verbally interact with people that stop at primary?"
- 7 **B:** "We don't have a standard set of questioning..."
- 8 **D:** "But normally they say something."
- 9 **B:** "Normally yeah..."
- 10 **D:** "Right, do they ever or is it in their training to just stand there and stare at individuals stopped at primary?"
- 12 **B:** "I've not been a part of that training"
- 13 **D:** "OK, so you're unaware of any particular training..."
- 14 **B:** "But at the same time, agents officers are always looking for anything suspicious. Now we do know
- 15 your immigration status but as law enforcement officers, we're still going to be looking around for any
- other criminal activity in that brief amount of time that you are detained"
- 17 **D:** "So even though you and the agent at primary knew who I was at the time, knew my immigration
- 18 status and knew that I wasn't subject to the...immigration...being, not being unlawfully in the
- 19 country...but you were still holding me there to look for other types of violations, other possible violations?"
- 21 **B:** "Any further detention after we already know your status, the agent would have to explain...I don't
- 22 know what he was looking for. Like I said, I was sitting over at the awning, saw you come up, waved,
- 23 went back to doing what I was doing and that's when I heard the agents yelling for you to stop."
- 24 **D:** "So I fully understand that you don't know exactly what..."
- 25 **B:** "Right, I don't know exactly what they were looking for..."
- 26 **D:** "But I'm looking for more policy statements at...from you now. So basically what you're saying is
- that even though um..you consider it all right for Mr. Grayson to keep me there even though he already knew my immigration status and hadn't...didn't say a word to me at all, just pulled out his camera..."

- 29 **B:** "I didn't necessarily say that. After the coarse of your brief detention at primary while we're
- establishing your immigration status, if the primary officer sees something, hears something, smells something that warrants further investigation then once we've concluded who you are, which you were
- 32 concluded pretty much when you came up, but if they've already seen something then they are allowed
- 33 to continue to briefly investigate."
- 34 **D:** "OK, so what was it that Mr...can you find out from Mr. Grayson what it was that elevated his
- 35 suspicion to hold me there?"
- 36 **B:** "Do you want me to ask him now?"
- 37 **D:** "Sure"
- 38 **B:** "*Standby*"
- 39 Agent Brandon walks over to Agent Grayson to ask him at approximately 1631.

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- **B:** "This is what I surmise from Agent Grayson. He's waved you through on several occasions. He's
- 2 familiar with your vehicle and you. More or less this time he was basically trying to get a better look at
- 3 you. He says the window sort of obscures that. I think that he was more or less trying to initiate a
- *conversation.*"
- **D:** "If he was, he didn't indicate for me to roll down the window, he didn't try to say a word to me just
- 6 stared at me and pulled out his camera with the other agent..."
- **B:** "Yeah he mentioned that they both had cameras um.."
- **D:** "I mean this is all on video here (garbled)"
- **B:** "And I'm not sure the mentality behind filming you. I don't know operationally why we would need
- *to do that...*"
- **D:** "Is that...so that's not part of official policy?"
- **B:** "No, there's no official policy that we're going to film people although some checkpoints do have
- 13 cameras"
- **D:** "Oh sure, right, right but obviously this is...I don't know if...is it an issued...is it an agency issued
- *camera?*"
- **B:** "I think it's just their own cell phones"
- **D:** "So it's their own cell phones. OK, so there's no particular policy that says agents operating
- primary stop location of an immigration checkpoint will stop vehicles, will not engage the vehicle
- 19 occupants and will take out their personal videotaping equipment and videotape the occupants"
- **B:** "No policy like that"
- **D:** "Is there a formal written policy that governs this checkpoint?"
- 22 At approximately 1635, a discussion on CBP checkpoint policies, both national and local, ensues.

- 23 At approximately 1646, the discussion picks up with Agent Brandon's intentions:
- **D:** "Do you intend on taking any corrective action with regards to how the agent handled himself at
- *primary?"*
- **B:** "Yes. Like I said the phone. I just don't see an operational need for that. I haven't asked him...did
- 27 both agents do it?"
- **D:** "Yes, they both had some recording device in their hand. I don't know if they were active or what..."
- **B:** "So I'm not sure the rationale behind that. I'll get that clarified to them if there's not a justifiable
- reason or if I see that it continues to interfere with operations. We'll have to address that and stop it
- *completely or...*"
- 32 Discussion continues regarding CBP policy on filming, posting, etc.
